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What the Church Needs Now Is Discernment

ou may remember the words recorded years ago by Jackie DeShannon as she reflected on a world full of hostility. "What the world needs now is love, it's the only thing that there's just too little of." Today, we lament the condition of the church which has lost its ability to distinguish between truth and error. Now we must sing a new verse. "What the church needs now is discernment, it is the only thing that there's just too little of, and not just for some but for everyone."

Several discouraging events have been brought to my attention in the last month. Each one shows a lack of discernment and a growing cause for alarm as this trend continues. We are seeing more and more evangelicals tolerate, endorse and/or embrace the fatal gospel of Roman Catholicism

Baptists and Catholics Together

Last month Park Cities Baptist Church invited Monsignor Don Zimmerman of Christ the King Catholic Church in Dallas to be the guest speaker for the men's Bible study on the book of Romans. I was shocked that the church leadership would be ignoring Paul's compassionate and emotion-filled warning to pastors: "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. I know that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves men will arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore be on the alert, remembering that night and day for a period of three years I did not cease to admonish each one with tears" (Acts 20:28-31). Knowing that the monsignor could cause believers to fall from their steadfastness and pure devotion to Christ, I had to warn the church leadership (2 Cor. 11:2).

In an urgent letter to Senior Pastor Jim Denison, I asked him to consider several key questions with biblical exhortations: As a good friend of the monsignor, have you ever shared the true Gospel of Jesus Christ with him? If so, what was his response? Are you aware that the gospel he preaches is condemned by the authority of God's word (Gal. 1:6-9)? Is he aware there are no more offerings for sin and no need for a sacerdotal priesthood? Are you aware that his church has condemned born-again Christians for trusting in the sufficiency of Jesus Christ and His atonement? Are you aware that the Catholic Church has a stated goal to unite all Christians under the power and influence of the Pope? Can you not see that your invitation to the monsignor is playing right into their hands and fueling the fires of ecumenism? Have you considered that your responsibility as an undershepherd is not only to feed the sheep but also to protect them from such wolves in sheep's clothing?

Since I did not receive any response from Dr. Denison, or anyone else from the church, I knew I had to put my faith in action and contend for the truth. Having taught seminars at the church on seven previous occasions, I had more than a casual interest in what was about to happen. Motivated by my passion for truth and love for my Lord, I asked my wife Jane to join me. We put on the full armor of God and petitioned our sovereign King for guidance, wisdom and pro-

tection. We then went out to warn the men of the "Trojan horse" who would be covertly entering the walls of their church.

As we stood outside of this Baptist Church, founded and sanctified by truth in 1939, we handed out our Gospel tract entitled *Is A Roman Catholic Christian An Oxymoron?* The tract clearly reveals that those who adhere to the gospel of Rome are not Christians. Less than five minutes after we arrived, one of the pastors came out and asked us to cease from handing out tracts and to get off the church property. I politely told him that we would leave the church property but we would continue to spread the truth about

the errors of Roman Catholicism from the street. We shared our grave concern that this church was

giving credibility to a purveyor of deceit and also giving validation to a false religion. We asked how the church leadership could ignore these commands from Scripture. "If anyone comes to you and does not bring this teaching, do not receive him" (2 John 10). "If anyone does not obey our instruction in this letter, take special note of that man and do not associate with him, so that he may be put to shame" (2 Thes 3:14).

A few minutes later, a security guard showed up to make sure we stayed off the church property. After handing out a few hundred tracts, we got in our car to leave and noticed the security guard was writing down our license plate number. What an irony! We are not secret agents for the Lord Jesus Christ! We would have gladly given him any information he requested; in fact, earlier we offered him one of our Gospel tracts which included our name, address, phone number and web site, but he refused to take it.

Meanwhile, the wolf in sheep's clothing had the attention of nearly 300 Baptist men. He delivered a message entitled: *Christians, Pagans and Paul.* Denison, who had been praying with the monsignor since 9/11/01, introduced him as a brother-in-Christ, thus giving credence to his false gospel. What a deplorable message of compromise for these Baptist men. Rather than learning the truth about the ungodly rituals and pagan traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, these men left the Bible study believing it was a valid representation of true Christianity.

Remember the Reformation?

On another front, I was informed that John Armstrong of *Reformation and Revival Ministry* had also made plans to invite a Roman Catholic priest and theologian to speak at his symposium entitled: *Law and Gospel*. In an exchange of e-mails with Armstrong, I expressed how disheartening it is to know that the one who directs a ministry with "*Reformation*" in the name has apparently forgotten the martyrs who were tortured and killed for refusing to do what he is now doing.

Armstrong said the priest, Father Tom Baima, provost of *St. Mary of the Lake Seminary* in Chicago is a brother in Christ because "his

love for Christ is present." I asked John, "Are you not aware that the Christ he

loves is not the Christ of Scripture? He loves a Christ that was unable to purify sinners from all sin, thus the need for purgatory. He worships a Christ that did not finish the work of redemption, thus the need for his liturgy. He believes in a Christ that he can call down from heaven each day to be offered as a victim for the propitiation of God's wrath. His Christ can be transubstantiated into a wafer that must be eaten to enter into heaven. His Christ did not atone for all sin, consequently Catholics must do penance to make satisfaction for their sins. His Christ is not the only sinless mediator but shares this role with His mother."

Armstrong's response to me was warm and cordial but he concluded with: "we simply do not agree about this issue."

Christian Products or Heresy?

On still another front, I went into Family Christian Bookstores last month and was annoyed and disturbed to, once again, see more capitulation and compromise. This national chain of stores now has a special section for Roman Catholic books and products which includes rosaries and gifts for infant baptisms. I picked out books by Scott Hahn and Mother Teresa and showed the manager how both authors pervert the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The manager's response: "Family Christian Stores are committed to providing Christian products that serve diverse needs within the whole body of Christ." I then contacted corporate headquarters to express my concern. The director's response

Ignoring the Curse

How should people react if they have been accursed by Almighty God? It should bring sheer terror, heart-rending despair, unbearable anguish and awesome fear. Why then do so many ignore the divine curse placed on those who distort God's Gospel? "I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; which is really not another; only there are some who are disturbing you, and want to distort the gospel of Christ. But even though we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we have preached to you, let him be accursed" (Gal. 1:6-9). Those who preach the damning heresy of another gospel are cursed and marked for destruction for deceiving their followers.

The prophet Nahum gives us a glimpse of what awaits those who have been accursed. "The Lord takes vengeance on His adversaries, and He reserves wrath for His enemies... and the Lord will by no means leave the guilty unpunished. Mountains quake because of Him, and the hills dissolve; Indeed the earth is upheaved by His presence, The world and all the inhabitants in it. Who can stand before His indignation? Who can endure the burning of His anger? His wrath is poured out like fire, And the rocks are broken up by Him" (Nahum 1:2-6)

Whose Side Are You On?

Jesus said, "He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me scatters" (Mat. 12:30). What are we doing with the precious gift of faith? There are only two possibilities. We can either earnestly contend for it, or do nothing. If we are not fighting for the faith, we are AWOL and allowing compromisers to go unrestrained. What should our response be to those who spread doctrinal error? We must aim the truth of God's word directly at the error! Truth is the only weapon that can destroy error.

Catholics & Mormons?

What do Catholics have in common with Mormons? Not only do they worship another Jesus and believe another gospel, but they both believe they can become gods. "For the Son of Man became man so that we might become God." (Par. 460, Catechism of the Catholic Church)

He states that "Mary is present, with the Church and as the Mother of the Church at each of our celebrations of the Eucharist." New Rule For Eucharist


While the changes might seem minor, the first revisions the Vatican has made to the mass since 1975 will affect every Roman Catholic who walks forward for communion. Before they take the bread and wine, they'll have to bow, as a sign of reverence for the Eucharist. Roman Catholics believe the bread and wine becomes the actual body and blood of Christ during the mass. Catholics also must be quieter during the mass, sitting meditatively in silence before it begins, after the homily, and after they receive communion instead of chatting with neighbors, or whispering to the kids.

Instead he is explaining the practical impossibility of living under both law and grace. To "fall from grace" is to fall from the "principle" of

grace. Any Christian who chooses to live under the principle of law will be entangled with its voke of bondage and will not enjoy the freedom of grace. Those who trust Christ are made complete in Him (Col. 2:10) and share the riches of His grace (Eph. 1:7). Conversely, a Christian who is persuaded to fall from the principle of grace, becomes a debtor to the whole law and has thus been severed from the liberty of living in Christ. When we contrast law with grace, it is a wonder that anyone would chose to live under the law. Law gives us work to do to be saved, grace reveals the work is finished. Law says "do"; grace says "done." Law condemns the best of us, grace justifies the worst of us. Law reveals sin, grace forgives sin. Those under the law obey out of fear, those under grace obey out of love. Law reveals man's weakness, grace empowers man with divine strength. Breaking the law brought separation from God, receiving grace brings reconciliation to God. God's grace is amazing indeed!

You have been misguided by the father of lies and are leading others who do not know their faith out of the church founded by the Lord. A confidential 1962 Vatican policy instructs bishops, cardinals and other officials to pursue such matters "in a most secretive way." The document surfaced last week in Massachusetts. It's not just a smoking gun, attorney Larry Drivon of Stockton said yesterday. "It is a smoking cannon." Driven said, "This report tells these people exactly how to cover up these cases and for what purpose and to what degree, and it says that if anybody doesn't, they'd be excommunicated." For more than a year, the Catholic Church has been under siege across the country by allegations of sexual abuse by priests, particularly against minors, in cases that go back for decades. Hundreds of lawsuits have been filed, and more than 300 priests have stepped down or been removed. A key part of the abuse scandal has been reports that bishops quietly transferred offending priests from parish to parish. (San Diego Union Tribune, 8/7/03)

Graham Rally Encourages Interfaith Unity With Catholics

A year after Billy Graham packed Paul Brown Stadium and drew streams of people to his altar call, churches aren't reporting a surge of converts. They do, however, believe Graham succeeded in building stronger interfaith ties among people of different denominations. "The centuries have created many divisions between us, but when we go back to the cross and the basic gospel proclamation we all proclaim, it's so freeing," said Curtis Kneblik, assistant director of evangelization for the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

The Graham event lit a fire in Northern Kentucky by adding another ecumenical service for Protestants and Catholics. When Graham held his first crusades in the early 1950s, he drew his support from Protestant churches. But that's changed, of the 11,212 who accepted Graham's invitation to come forward and receive Christ, 1,221 were Catholic. What went unfulfilled was any expectation that the crusade would produce a multitude of Christian converts. Most of the 42 referrals Graham sent to Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Church are still involved there. One referral said that Graham's message encouraged her "to make a final decision to become a Catholic." (Cincinnati Post, 6/28/03)

Vatican Knowingly Promoted Abusive Priest

The Vatican promoted a U.S. priest through its international diplomatic corps despite high-level warnings in the 1990s that he had sexually abused a girl. The case is believed to be the first in which the Vatican has been found harboring an abuser in its ranks. In a message during last year's abuse crisis, Pope John Paul II said: "There is no place in the priesthood or religious life for those who would harm the young." Alerts about Monsignor Daniel Pater went to Bishop James M. Harvey, who now heads the pope's personal staff. Bishop Harvey acknowledged that he had known "there'd been some problems" with Pater but said that he was not in a position to affect the priest's career. A lawsuit against Monsignor Pater had ended with a confidential payment to his accuser in 1995. Monsignor Pater, 50, remains a priest in good standing, even though U.S. bishops passed a one-strike-and-you're-out policy last year in Dallas. Bishop Harvey has been head of the papal household for five years. In elevating him to that post, the pope referred to him as "my faithful collaborator." The Rev. Thomas Doyle, who formerly worked in the Vatican's U.S. embassy, called the situation "profound and shattering, because this connects several dots: A. They did know. B. They kept it covered. C. They violated their own code of ethics." Pater was a newly ordained priest when he sexually abused the 14 year old girl. He assured her that his sexual advances were proper in the eyes of the Catholic Church. Later he wrote this note, dated Oct. 1, 1982, in her high school yearbook: "My best and closest friend during my time at Saint Charles. I hope that this love and understanding lasts into the years." After Pater had begun his diplomatic service for the Vatican in Australia and then Zaire, he would continue to have sex with the girl on his trips back to the U.S. By 1997, Msgr. Pater had earned a promotion to the Vatican Embassy in Turkey. (Dallas Morning News, 8/30/03)

Tears From Mary's Statue

The tears of the Blessed Virgin are a call to conversion and peace, particularly in the Mideast and Africa, says John Paul II. When meeting with pilgrims to pray, the Pope recalled the 50th anniversary of the day that an image of Mary wept in Syracuse, Sicily. On Aug. 29, 1953, a plaster plaque of the Immaculate Heart of Mary shed tears. The miraculous phenomenon, recognized officially by Sicily's bishops, was prolonged for three consecutive days. Today those tears are preserved in a reliquary that was taken to all Sicilian parishes during the current extraordinary Marian Year. Pilgrims presented a gold crown for John Paul II's blessing then to be placed on the head of the Virgin's image. "How mysterious these tears are!" the Pope said. "They speak of suffering and tenderness, of comfort and divine mercy and are the sign of a maternal presence." The Pontiff concluded with a prayer addressed to the "sweet Lady of Tears," entrusting to her the Church and the whole world. He concluded: "May your tears, O Mother, be a pledge of conversion and peace for all your children." (Zenit.org, 8/31/03)

The Price of Perversion

An \$85 million settlement for 542 alleged victims of clergy sexual abuse has been reached in the Archdiocese of Boston. The agreement will provide \$80,000 to \$300,000 per victim depending on the extent of the abuse. Massachusetts Attorney General Thomas Reilly released a report stating over 1,000 children probably had been sexually abused by priests between 1940 and 2000.

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
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

was: "While Roman Catholicism is not my denomination, and I personally don't believe so much symbolism is necessary, I can accept them as brothers and sisters in Christ. Many Catholics I know are true believers in Jesus Christ and I refuse to divide the body."

Unlikely Sources for Truth

On yet another front, a large *evangelical* tract publisher called me to critique a tract they were ready to print called: *The Road to Heaven According to the Roman Catholic Faith*. The tract had quotes from Pope John Paul II, <u>The Council of Trent</u>, a Roman Catholic Cardinal and the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>. I advised them that the Apostle Paul never quoted the Judaizers as a credible source for truth about the Gospel. I told him that his firm should not give credibility to statements from a religion that opposed and condemned the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

These are just a few tragic examples of how some evangelicals have selfishly and conveniently overlooked what the Reformation was all about. Many of the Reformers were brutally tortured and burned at the stake for exposing the fatal flaws of Rome's gospel -

the very gospel that these evangelicals are now endorsing. These evangelicals have either forgotten the Reformers who boldly and courageously refused to accommodate error, or they believe they were foolishly wrong to die for the truth.

It is difficult enough to live the victorious Christian life of overcoming the world, without also having to engage in doctrinal battles within our own camp. However, we must maintain doctrinal purity and remain separate from those who preach another gospel. False gospels cannot be tolerated. Those who preach them must be identified as unbelievers and not introduced as our brothers-in-Christ. Their lies hold men captive in prisons which ultimately become their tombs.

It is time for Christians to emulate the apostles and be inspired by their uncompromising mission to spread the Gospel and expose its counterfeits. Might there be an awakening in these last days! Let us pray that God will empower us with His Spirit to live according to His word. As an expression of our love for our glorified Savior, let us actively and earnestly contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints (Jude 3).
